Flood Preparedness Plan

Flooding is one of the most common and dangerous natural disasters. Proper preparation can significantly reduce risks and improve safety. This checklist will help you create a flood preparedness plan to protect your home, family, and belongings.

1. Before a Flood - Preparation Steps
[] Know your flood risk by checking FEMA flood maps for your area
[] Sign up for local emergency alerts and weather warnings
[] Prepare an emergency kit with food, water, medications, and essentials
[] Have a family evacuation plan and designate meeting points
[] Store important documents in a waterproof and fireproof container
[] Ensure your insurance covers flood damage (standard policies may not)
[] Install check valves in plumbing to prevent floodwater backup
[] Elevate electrical outlets, appliances, and utilities above flood level
[] Keep emergency contact numbers handy, including local shelters
[] If you live in a flood-prone area, consider flood barriers or sandbags
2. During a Flood - Safety Measures
[] Follow local emergency alerts and evacuation orders
[] If evacuation is required, leave immediately and avoid delays
[] Move to higher ground if you are in a flood-prone area
[] Turn off electricity and gas before floodwaters reach your home
[] Never walk or drive through floodwaters - even 6 inches can sweep you awa
[] Keep children and pets indoors and away from floodwaters
[] If trapped in a building, move to the highest floor and call for help
[] Avoid contact with floodwater as it may contain sewage and debris
[] Use a battery-powered radio to stay updated on emergency information
[] Have an emergency go-bag ready in case you must leave quickly
3. After a Flood - Recovery & Cleanup
[] Wait for authorities to declare your area safe before returning home
[] Check your home for structural damage before entering
[] Use protective gear (gloves, boots, masks) when cleaning up flood damage
[] Throw away food, water, or medications exposed to floodwater
[] Disinfect all surfaces and remove standing water to prevent mold growth
[] Document property damage with photos for insurance claims
[] Check for gas leaks or electrical hazards before turning power back on
[] Contact FEMA or local disaster relief agencies if you need assistance
[] Boil tap water until authorities confirm it is safe to drink
Monitor your health for any illness related to flood exposure

Flood safety starts with preparation. Stay informed, stay safe!
